Learn more from a portable device vs. classroom


Uses phones vs. watches, cameras, calendars, & board games

How Does Generation Z Feel About Going to College?


Going to College is in Their View



Gen Zers more likely to be enrolled in college and to have a college-educated parent than Millennials, Gen Xers at a comparable age

What is the Cost of Attendance?

Student Loan Debt in 2020



- Student loan debt in 2020 = \$1.56 Trillion
- Average student loan debt=\$32,731
- Average student loan payment= \$393.00
- Total U.S. borrowers with student loan debt =
 44.7 million
- 5.5 million borrowers have defaulted on direct loans = \$119.8 billion

 - Career Guidance




Freshman Mistakes – Cont'd

- 97% of college students use their phones during class for noneducational purposes
- Direct link to texting and poor grades






Freshman Mistakes – Cont'd

- 15 credit = 30 hours of outside studying









